



Position Title: Clinician (full time)

Reports to: Screening Site Coordinator; CCWS Program Director

Position Summary

The Wellness Screen Clinician will oversee and participate in daily screening activities at assigned school sites, and work closely with Wellness Screen Case Managers as well as the Screening Site Coordinator. The Clinician will be responsible for effectively communicating with parents, clinicians, students and school staff. Flexibility and ability to travel within school systems is a must. The Clinician will be responsible for their assigned school's screening calendar and recording/reporting out of screening data to program and school staff regularly throughout the year.

The Clinician will be responsible for the follow up screening process after a student is identified through the screening process as having a possible emotional or behavioral concern:

- Clinician will conduct a 20-30 minute follow up interview with youth who have scored positive on the screening tool, and/or those who have been identified & referred for a follow up interview through the debriefing process. (Youth Report Process)
- Clinician will conduct a follow up interview with the parent of youth who have scored positive on the parent-report screening tool and with students whom have been identified after gaining consent from parent. (Parent Report Process)
- Provide case management according to Wellness Screen procedures in connecting families to resources that are recommended
- Deliver program presentations for students, parents and school staff within our school sites
- Assist with set up and delivery of screening process at each assigned site
- Contribute knowledge and expertise to our newsletter and marketing opportunities as they come available.
- Provide communication to school sites where assigned, outcome trends within the screening process so that we may support the school in providing necessary supports if applicable (ex: anxiety support groups, LGBTQ supports, bullying solutions, etc).

Required Qualifications

- Master's degree or higher-level mental health clinician or master's level students currently enrolled in a clinical mental health program.
- Independent experience assessing youth for symptoms of mental illness/emotional health concerns and suicide risk is required.
- Minimum of a Bachelor's degree in psychology/social work or human services related field
- Minimum of 3 years work experience in a mental health setting
- Minimum of 1 year experience providing case management
- Experience using DSM-5 (or most current version) a criterion for assessing youth is required.

Recommended

- Licensed mental health practitioners (e.g., clinical social worker, licensed mental health provider/therapist, clinical psychologist, and child psychiatrist) with a minimum of two years post-graduate work experience in mental health assessment of youth.

The role of the Wellness Screen Clinician is often limited to licensed mental health professionals. In the event the role of the clinician is being filled by an unlicensed master's level clinician (ie. Master's level intern staff), the unlicensed mental health professional would need to have the program's Clinical Supervisor, sign off on cases within 24 hours, and employee must meet required qualifications.
